OFFICE ORDER

Whereas the Govt. of Odisha in Revenue & Disaster Management Department (DM) has imposed further restrictions in the content of increasing incidence of Covid-19.

And Whereas, night curfew has been imposed vide Govt. Order No. 1714 dt. 03.04.2021 in the districts of Odisha bordering Chhatisgarh in application of Section 24 (1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 read with Rule 8(1) of the Disaster management Rules, 2010 from 05.04.2021 till further order.

And Whereas, it is felt necessary to give effect to the associated regulations through in the district of Jharsuguda.

Now therefore, I Sri Saroj Kumar Samal, OAS(SAG), District Magistrate, Jharsuguda by virtue of the powers vested in me under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973, do hereby order as under.

1. **Night Curfew** shall be in force in the entire jurisdiction of Jharsuguda district from **05.04.2021**.
2. The duration of the Night curfew will be from **10.00 PM to 5 AM everyday**, unless otherwise notified.
3. Movement of any nature, except the ones mentioned hereunder, shall cease during the notified period.
4. All shops, restaurants, offices, commercial establishments, markets and movement of individuals shall remain closed/prohibited in this period.
5. The following activities/personnel are allowed during the curfew period.
 - a. Administrative and police personnel on duty.
 - b. Doctors, medical staff, hospital staff, ambulance etc.
 - c. Emergency workers of all public utilities like railways, Water Supply, Electricity, Fire, Transport Services, Telcom, etc.
 - d. Chemist shop owner and their staff.
 - e. Any person, in case of medical or other emergency
 - f. Staff of IT & ITeS Companies on production of their ID cards

- g. Operation of Industrial units and movement of the staff.
- h. All construction activities, whether Government or private.
- i. Movement of Public Transport, private vehicles and taxis(including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.) to and from airports, railway station and bus terminals/stands/stops for facilitating movement of passengers by air, rail and road.
- j. Hotels with accommodation.
- k. Dhabas along Highways for takeaway only.
- l. Petrol pumps
- m. Media personnel as allowed by District police with ID cards
- n. LPG delivery
- o. Home delivery of food, Grocery, vegetables, egg, fish, meat and other essential items by vendors

6. The Executive magistrates will be overall responsible for the strict enforcement of the order.
7. The Superintendent of Police may brief all personnel accordingly and chart out the overall enforcement action plan for the district.
8. No passes would be required for the exempted personnel. An ID card or a travel document would be evidence enough.
9. Any person found violating these regulations will be liable for action under Section 188 of the Indian Penal Code as well as section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897.


