

Section -1: Introduction

Jharsuguda is one of the most industrially developed District of Odisha and was established on 1st January, 1994. Earlier it was a part of Sambalpur District. The district is surrounded by Sundargarh District in the North, Sambalpur District in the East, Bargarh District in the South and Chhattisgarh state in the West. Total population of the district is 579505 consisting of 352 villages. Urban Population is 231165 and rural population is 348340. Total male population of the district is 296690 and female population is 282815. As per the administrative set up of the district is concerned, Jharsuguda District has got one sub division namely Jharsuguda. There are total five Tahasils (Jharsuguda, Lakhanpur, Laikera, Kolabira-N and Kirmira-N) in the District. Total five Blocks (Jharsuguda, Lakhanpur, Kolabira, Laikera, Kirmira) are there in the district. Several industrial units like Vendanta Alumina, Bhusan Steel and Power, TATA Refractories are operating in the district that contribute to the economic growth of the district. This District is also having good communication facility with a Railway Junction and Airport located at northern part of the district for which the district is so much preferable for the outsiders to work in the district.

1.1. Background and Need of Working Women's Hostel


Finding a suitable accommodation is a major problem for working women in Jharsuguda town. In the absence of a hostel, the women are forced to stay in rented accommodations while house owners charge a hefty amount as rent. Moreover, owners are often reluctant to give their houses on rent to single women. Looking at the fact Department of Women and Child Development and Mission Shakti, Government of Odisha had decided to set up a Working women's Hostel in the District to facilitate the Working Women for safe staying.

Administration of the District intends to appoint an Organization/ Agency for management of Working Women's Hostel located at Kapumal of the Jharsuguda District. It is a three storied structure with a capacity accommodate 100 working women. The centre has a provision of a Day Care Centre, which will provide day care facility to the inmates of the Working women's hostel. In case the centre has space to accommodate more children, outside children can also be accommodated. The centre will be operated under the direct supervision of District WWH Supervisory Committee.

The newly constructed three storied building has provisions of single/ double rooms and dormitory. Also, the structure has a common activity room. Each floor has toilets and bathrooms. It also has a kitchen where food will be cooked to be served to the inmates (on payment basis). The hostel will provide accommodation to working, unmarried and separated women, widows, divorcees besides those receiving training for employment.


1.2. Location of the Project

The WWH is located at Ward No-9 in the Kapumal industrial area of Jharsuguda municipality which is 7 KM away from the Veer Surendra Sai Airport also known as Jharsuguda Airport, 3 KM away from Jharsuguda Railway Station, 2.5 Km from old bus stand of Jharsuguda and around 4.5 KM from the New Bus terminal of Jharsuguda. The google map location is attached below for reference marked as Kapumal.



1.3. Details of Hostel Building

The Hostel building was constructed under the supervision of IDCO with a cost of Rs.348.41 Lakh and is situated in the Kapumal Industrial area with a very good surrounding and well connected by Road. It's a three storied building with having 20 nos of double seated room, 10 nos of four seated dormitory and 20 nos of single room attached with toilet. Besides, there are provision of Ramp, Common Toile, Handicap Toile, Office Room, Visitors Room, Dining Hall, Kitchen Room, Pantry, Store Room and the total area is surrounded by a strong boundary wall with an entrance gate and small gate provision. For reference the plan drawing of 1st floor and ground floor is given below.



Section 2: Definitions

- 2 "DWSC" is the District WWH Supervisory Committee, Jharsuguda.

- 10 "RFP" means the Request for Proposal circulated by the DSWO for the selection of Agency(s).
- 11 "Assignment/job" means the work to be performed by the Agency pursuant to the Contract.
- 12 "Terms of Reference" (ToR) means the information included in the RFP which explain the objectives, scope of work, activities, tasks to be performed, respective responsibilities of the DSWC and the selected Agency(s).
- 13 "Competent Authority" means Collector-cum-Chairperson, District WWH Supervisory Committee (DSWC), Jharsuguda, Government of Odisha.

2. Proposals must be submitted on or before the prescribed date, time and venue mentioned in the Fact Sheet. Proposals received after cut-off date will be summarily rejected.
3. Scope of work may increase / decrease. However, the DWSC reserves the right to cancel the RFP without citing any reasons thereof.

4.1 Duration of the Project

The duration of the project will be initially for a period of 3 (three) years which may be extended further upon satisfactory performance of the Agency. However, the extension of the project is based on the sole discretion of DWSC.

Section 5: Scope of Work & Terms of Reference

5.1 Management of Working Women's Hostel:

A 100 bedded Working Women's Hostel has been constructed at Kapumal of Jharsuguda district which shall be managed by the agency in a non-profit basis.

Objective of WWH:

- Promote availability of safe and conveniently located accommodation for working women, with day care facility for their children, wherever possible, in urban areas where employment opportunity for women exists thereby creating a conducive environment for women to work in formal sector.
- To provide accommodation for the children of working women who are up to the age of 10 years in case of girl child and 6 years in case of boys and will reside with their mothers.
- Day care services (creche) for children of working women of the locality irrespective of stay in the hostel.

5.2 Selection of Beneficiaries:

The working women / girls (hereinafter referred as working women), who are above the age of 18 years, fulfilling other conditions mentioned in the guideline for admission and are either-

- Single, widowed, divorced, separated, married but whose husband or immediate family doesn't reside in the same city or area can apply for admission in the Working Women Hostel.
- Girls up to the age of 10 years and boys up to the age of 6 years can stay in the hostel accompanying with their mothers.
- Care leavers' girls / women of above category from any Child Care Institutions (CCIs) of Odisha shall be given first priority in admission.

5.3 Scope of Work & Responsibility of Selected Agency:

1. The overall responsibility of day-to-day management of WWH lies with the Superintendent of the Hostel and the selected agency shall function as prescribed in the guidelines. And if not, specifically mentioned in the guideline then while taking decision best interest of the inmates shall be kept in mind.
2. For overall operational monitoring, supervision, compliance of the guideline and coordination, the agency shall form one Hostel Management Committee (HMC) for the hostel and ensure that HMC meets on a monthly basis and shares quarterly, half-yearly and annual reports to the DWSC.

The agency / organization selected shall be responsible for the following:

1. Appointment of staff and their capacity building initiatives.
2. Management of day care Centre.

3. Day to day management of the Centre including day to day maintenance, house-keeping, security services, office establishment, expenditure towards water and electricity charges and any other responsibility as bestowed by the DWSC.
4. The agency shall ensure that a minimum of 15% of the fees collected every month from WHH and day care center is deposited with DWSC as corpus fund. In case the agency is unable to deposit the same for consecutive period of 3 months, a show cause notice /and legal action with cancellation of contract shall be initiated.
5. The rent collected from the inmates doesn't include user charges for mess, cafeteria, facilities like washing machine, creche, amusement, sports, internet and computer services, laundry services etc. and such other services as decided by DWSC user charges shall be separately collected by the agency from the inmates of WHH.
6. The corpus fund deposited with DWSC shall be used for undertaking major structural repairs of the building.
7. The Day care Centre managed for the inmates of the WHH can accommodate outside children if the Centre has sufficient space for the same provided it is approved by the DWSC.
8. Agency shall ensure that complete details of children admitted to Day care are maintained including list of their parents with contact details. The enrolment forms of children duly filled in by the parents (containing Address Proof, Photo, PAN, Aadhar Card and organizations' ID etc) shall be available with the staff in the Day care Centre. It shall be responsible for the safety of the children in the Centre.
9. The agency /Organization shall ensure that the building is used for which constructed and shall not be used for any other purpose without permission of the Dept. of WCD & MS.
10. The agency shall prominently display on the building, the name of the Hostel and endorsement "Supported by the Department of Women and Child Development and MS, Government of Odisha & District Social Welfare Office, Jharsuguda", in Odia/Hindi & English.
11. It shall ensure the maintenance of records of all assets acquired wholly or substantially out of any grant. Such assets shall not be disposed or utilized for the purpose other than those for which the grant has been sanctioned.
12. Regular maintenance, repairs, upkeep etc. of the working women's hostel shall be done by the agency / organization to ensure that the building or hostel remains in the good condition.
13. Ex-Servicemen shall be deployed considered for watch and ward duties in the working women's hostel.
14. Hostel management MIS developed by Department of WCD & MS, Govt. of Odisha shall be used for all activities of the Hostel.
15. The agency shall ensure CCTV is installed at the main access, entry in the office and around the premises with a provision to keep Video back up of at least 30 days.
16. The Day care Centre should be maintained clean and well ventilated. It should have adequate and safe play area outside the Centre with play and reading materials for the children.
17. The agency shall ensure display of various helpline numbers at the reception.
18. The agency shall keep itself updated of the contact details of all inmates with their emergency contact numbers.
19. The agency shall provide First Aid facility and ensure arrangements to reach to a

doctor or nearest hospital in case of emergency.

Section 6: Instruction of Bidding

6.1 General Instructions:

1. From the time of Bid advertisement to the time of contract award, if any bidder wishes to contact the DSWO or any designated officer of the DSWO on any matter related to the bid, it should be done so in writing at the address mentioned in Bid Factsheet.
2. The Bids shall remain valid for a period of 90 days after the bid submission deadline as prescribed by the Collector & Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda in this RFP.
3. The Agency can only submit one proposal. If any Agency submits or participates in more than one proposal, all such proposal shall be disqualified.
4. Any bid NOT accompanied by an enforceable and compliant bid security (EMD) may be rejected by the Collector & Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda as non-responsive.
5. The bid security of unsuccessful Bidders shall be returned as promptly as possible upon award of contract and receipt of performance security from the successful Bidder. No interest will be payable on the amount of Bid Security.
6. The Bid security will be forfeited by the Collector & Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda on account of one or more of the following reasons:
 - a. If the Bidder withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity.
 - b. If the successful bidder fails to sign the contract in accordance with Terms & Conditions of this RFP.
 - c. In the case of a successful bidder fails to furnish Performance Bank Guarantee within specified time.

6.2 Clarifications:

1. Bidders requiring any clarification on the RFP may notify the Authority in writing by post or e-mail to the address in accordance with relevant Clause. They should send their queries before the date mentioned in the Schedule of Bidding Process specified in relevant Clause, the Authority shall endeavor to respond to the queries within the period specified therein. The responses will be sent by post or e-mail. The Authority will forward all the queries and its responses thereto, to all Bidders without identifying the source of queries.
2. The Authority shall endeavor to respond to the questions raised or clarifications sought by the Bidders. However, the Authority reserves the right not to respond to any question or provide any clarification, in its sole discretion, and nothing in this Clause shall be taken or read as compelling or requiring the Authority to respond to any question or to provide any clarification.
3. The Authority may also on its own motion, if deemed necessary, issue interpretations and clarifications to all Bidders. All clarifications

and interpretations issued by the Authority shall be deemed to be part of the Bidding Documents. Verbal clarifications and information given by Authority or its employees or representatives shall not in any way or manner be binding on the Authority.

4. Any Cancellation/ Addendum/ Corrigendum thus issued relating to RFP will be published in the Jharsuguda District Website "www.jharsuguda.nic.in".
5. At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Proposals, the Authority may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to clarifications requested by a Bidder, modify the RFP by the issuance of Corrigendum notice.
6. In order to afford the Bidders a reasonable time for taking an Addendum into account, or for any other reason, the Authority may, at its own discretion, extend the Proposal Due Date, if necessary.
7. At any time prior to the last date of receipt of the bids, Collector and Chairperson, DWSC Jharsuguda may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification raised by a prospective bidder, modify the Bidding Document through a Corrigendum.
8. Any such corrigendum shall become part of this RFP.
9. In order to provide prospective bidder reasonable time for taking the corrigendum into account, Collector and Chairperson, DWSC Jharsuguda may, at its discretion, extend the last date for the submission of the Bid.
10. Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda reserves the right to cancel the RFP or reject all the bid applications without assigning any reasons at any stage of bidding process.

6.3 Sealing, Marking and Submission of Bids:

1. The Bidder shall provide all the information sought under this RFP. The Authority will evaluate only those Proposals that are received in the required formats and are complete in all respect.
2. The Proposal shall be typed or written in indelible ink and signed by the authorized signatory of the Bidder who shall also initial each page, in blue ink. All the alternations, omissions, additions or any other amendments made to the Proposal shall be initialized by the person(s) signing the Bid.
3. The Bidder shall submit the Proposal in the format specified in relevant Clause, and seal it in envelopes.
4. The documents accompanying the Proposal shall be placed in 02 (Two) separate envelopes and marked on the cover as "**Request for Proposal (RFP) for Selection of an Organization/Agency for Operation and Management of Working Women's Hostel at Kapumal of Jharsuguda District under District Social Welfare Office, Jharsuguda**"

6.4 Site visit and verification of information:

The Bidders are encouraged to submit their respective Proposal after visiting the site and any other matter considered relevant by them. It shall be deemed that by submitting a Proposal, the Bidder has:

1. Made a complete and careful examination of the Bidding Documents;
2. Received all relevant information requested from the Authority;
3. Acknowledged and accepted the risk of inadequacy, error or mistake in the information provided in the Bidding Documents or furnished by or on behalf of the Authority relating to any of the matters above;
4. Satisfied itself about all matters, things and information necessary

and required for submitting an informed Proposal, execution of the Project in accordance with the Bidding Documents and performance of all of its obligations there under;

5. Acknowledged and agreed that inadequacy, lack of completeness or incorrectness of information provided in the Bidding Documents or ignorance of any of the matters shall not be a basis for any claim for compensation, damages, extension of time for performance of its obligations, loss of profits etc. from the Authority, or a ground for termination of the Service Agreement; and
6. Agreed to be bound by the undertakings provided by it under and in terms hereof.
7. The Authority shall not be liable for any omission, mistake or error on the part of the Bidder in respect of any of the above or on account of any matter or thing arising out of or concerning or relating to RFP, the Bidding Documents or the Bidding Process, including any error or mistake therein or in any information or data given by the Bidder.

6.5 Rights to Accept/Reject any or all Bids:

Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda reserves the right to accept or reject any bid, and to annul the bidding process and reject all Bids at any time prior to award of Contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected Bidder or Bidders or any obligation to inform the affected Bidder or Bidders of the grounds for Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda action.

6.6 Language of Bid:

The proposal and all correspondence and documents shall be written in English. In case of accompanying literature or brochures etc., being in a language other than English, a certified translation should accompany the documents as a part of the RFP. All proposals and accompanying documentation will become the property of Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda.

6.7 Modification and Withdrawal of Bids:

No proposal may be modified / withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of proposals and the expiration of the validity period specified by the Bidder on the proposal form. In case the Bidder wishes to withdraw the Bid after the date of opening of the bids, the bidder may do so, but the EMD of the Bidder shall be forfeited.

1. A Bidder wishing to withdraw its bid shall notify to Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda by e- mail prior to the deadline prescribed for bid submission. A withdrawal notice may also be sent by electronic means such as e-mail, but it must be followed by a signed confirmation copy, postmarked no later than the deadline for submission of bids.
2. No bid should be withdrawn in the interval between the bid submission deadline and the expiration of the bid validity period specified in the Bid Data Sheet. Withdrawal of a bid during this interval may result in the forfeiture of the Bidder's EMD.

6.8 Notifications of awards and Signing of Contract:

1. Prior to the expiration of the period of bid validity, the Bidder will be notified in writing or by email that their bid has been accepted.
2. Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda notifies the successful Bidder about the bid acceptance, and will send the Bidders the proforma for Contract, incorporating all clauses/agreements between the parties. The successful Bidder shall sign and date the Contract and return it to Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda for record purpose.

6.9 Performance Bank Guarantee:

1. The successful Bidder at own expenses shall deposit the Bank Guarantee with the Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda, within 15 (fifteen) days after the receipt of notification of award of the Contract (Letter of Award) from Collector and Chairperson, DWSC Jharsuguda. An unconditional and irrevocable Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG) from a Nationalized/Scheduled Commercial Bank acceptable to Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda, in the format prescribed in this RFP payable on demand, for the due performance and fulfillment of the Agreement by the Bidder.
2. The Performance Bank Guarantee may be submitted as Bank guarantee from a Nationalized/Scheduled Commercial Bank.
3. This Performance Bank Guarantee shall be for an amount equivalent to 5 % of Total Project Cost. All incidental charges whatsoever such as premium, commission etc., with respect to the Performance Guarantee shall be borne by the Bidder. The Performance Guarantee shall be valid for six months post completion of the Project subject to the terms and conditions in the contract.

6.10 Failure to agree with the Terms and Conditions of the Bid/Contract:

1. Failure of the Bidder to agree with the Terms and Conditions of the bid/Contract shall constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award of contract, in which event the contract may be awarded to the next most responsive Bidder.

6.11 Legal and Stationery Charges:

1. The successful bidder will have to bear the legal & stationery charges at rates for preparing contract documents as per prevailing circular. The stamp duty payable for the contract shall be borne by the Implementation Agency.
2. The successful Bidder shall enter into a contract agreement with Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda within 30 days from the date of issue of Work Order and the same should be adjudicated for payment of Stamp Duty by the successful Bidder.
3. All legal charges and incidental expenses in this respect shall be borne and paid by the successful Bidder.

i. Bid Currencies

Prices shall be quoted in Indian Rupees (INR).

ii. Bid Validity Period

The proposals shall be valid for a period of 90 days from the deadline of submission of Bids. On completion of the validity period, unless the Bidder withdraws proposal in writing, it will be deemed to be valid until such time that the Bidder formally (in writing) withdraws proposal.

6.12 Rectification of Errors:

1. Bidders are advised to exercise adequate care in quoting the prices. No excuse for corrections in the quoted price will be entertained after the proposals are opened. All corrections, if any, should be initialed by the person signing the proposal form before submission, failing which the figures for such items may not be considered.
2. Arithmetic errors in proposals will be corrected as per unit rates quoted.

6.13 Bidder Qualification:

1. The Bidder may nominate a duly Authorized Representative and shall submit a Certificate of authority. All Certificates and documents (including any clarifications sought and any subsequent correspondences) received hereby, shall, as far as possible, be furnished and signed by the authorized representative.
2. The authorization shall be indicated by written Power of Attorney (as per Agency's format) accompanying the Qualification Bid.

6.14 Conflict of Interest:

DWSC requires that Agency shall perform the required services, provide professional, objective, and impartial advice and at all times hold the DWSC's interest's paramount, strictly avoid conflicts of interest with other assignments or their own interests and act without any consideration for future work.

Without limitation on the generality of the foregoing, Agency and any of their affiliates, considered to have a conflict of interest shall not be engaged, under any of the circumstances set forth below:

6.15 Conflicting Relationships:

- 1 An Agency (including its Personnel and Sub-Agencies) that has a business or family relationship with a member of the DSWO staff who is directly or indirectly involved in any part of (a) the preparation of the terms of reference of the Assignment, (b) the selection process for such Assignment or (c) supervision of the Contract, may not be awarded a Conflict, unless the conflict stemming from this relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to the DWSC throughout the selection process and the execution of the Contract.

6.16 Unfair Advantage

If an Agency could derive a competitive advantage from having provided other services related to the assignment in question, the DWSC shall make available to all other Agencies together with this RFP all information that would in that respect give such Agency any competitive advantage over competing Agencies.

6.17 Fraud and Corruption

It is required that Agencies participating in the project adhere to the

highest ethical standards, both during the selection process and throughout the execution of a contract.

The DWSC defines the terms set forth below as follows:

- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting, directly or indirectly or anything of value to influence the action of a public official or members of the Evaluation Committee, in the selection process or in contract execution;
- "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a selection process or the execution of a contract;
- "Collusive practices" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Agencies with or without the knowledge of the DWSC, designed to establish prices, artificial, non-competitive levels;
- "Coercive practices" means harming or threatening to harm, indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process or affect the execution of a contract;
- Will reject a proposal for award, if it determines that the Agencies recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the contract in question:
- Applicant Agencies should be aware of the provisions on fraud and corruption stated in the specific clauses in the Contract.
- Agencies shall furnish information on commission and gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid to agents relating to this proposal and during execution of the assignment if the Agency is awarded contract.

6.18 Award of Contract:

- After completing negotiations, the DWSC shall issue a Letter of Intent to the selected Agency, and promptly notify all Agencies who have submitted proposals about the decision taken.
- The Agency will sign the contract after fulfilling all the formalities/pre-conditions within 15 days of issuances of the letter of interest.

6.19 Confidentiality:

Information relating to evaluation of Proposals and recommendations award shall not be disclosed to the Agencies who submitted the Proposals or to other persons not officially concerned with the process, until the publication of the award of Contract. The undue use by any Agency for accessing confidential information related to the process may result in the rejection of its Proposal.

6.20 Termination of the Contract:

The competent authority may, by a written notice of termination to the Bidder, suspend the Contract if the Bidder fails to perform any of its obligations under this Contract (including the carrying out of the services) provided that such notice of suspension.

- Shall specify the nature of the failure and
- Shall request the Bidder to make good such failure within a specified period from the date of receipt of such notice of suspension by the Bidder.

6.21 Competent Authority:

The Collector-cum-Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda shall be the competent authority for this project. The powers of the Competent Authority will be as under:

- May amend RFP documents during the proposal evaluation process. Any amendments will be conveyed to the short-listed organization / Agency;
- Modify scope of work at the time of the award of the contract. Such modifications will be discussed and agreed with the Agency.
- At discretion during evaluation of bids, request an Agency for clarification on its proposal. This request will be in writing and the Agency should respond in writing. No change in price or substance of the bid shall be sought, offered or permitted at this stage.
- The competent authority reserves the right to accept or reject any / all proposal partially or fully without assigning any reason thereof. The decision of the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all the Bidders.
- Any dispute in this regard shall be subject to Jharsuguda jurisdiction only.

Section- 8: Technical & Financial Bid

8.1 Instructions on Preparation of the Technical Proposal

- Bidders have to submit a very structured and organized technical bid, which will be analyzed by the Technical Evaluation Committee for different compliances with regards to the requirements of the project. The document submitted must be searchable and well indexed without any handwritten material. Since the cut-off marks for Technical bid Score is 60, the quality and completeness of the information submitted by the Bidder will matter a lot. All the documents must be submitted in one file only.

Bidder is expected to divide its Bid in following sections / documents:

8.1.1 Bidder's Competence to execute the project

This document should bring about the capability of the firm to execute this project. Some of the required documents are as follows:

- Experience in similar field.

8.1.2 Technical Proposal: The technical proposal should specify the following:

- Understanding of the Project
- Clear articulation and description of the design and technical/functional solution.
- Details of the complete solution proposed
- Integration approach with existing Infrastructure
- Reasoning for selection of the proposed technology over other options.
- Strength of the Bidder to provide services including examples or case-studies of similar solutions deployed for other Districts.
- Clearly articulate the Strategy and Approach and Methodology for Design, Implementation plan and Maintenance of Infrastructure components and Applications, if any, implemented in the project.
- Approach and Methodology for Management of Agreement Requirements specified in the bid. Bidder is required to clearly

articulate how the Agreement requirements would be adhered after signing of the agreement.

- Detailed Project Plan with timelines, resource allocation, milestones etc. for supply, installation and commissioning of the various items.

8.1.3 Other Details

8.1.4 Technical approach, methodology and work plan:

- To qualify the technical evaluation stage, the bidder must score a minimum of 60 marks. Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda will open the Financial Bids of those Bidders who will achieve minimum score of 60 marks in technical evaluation
- Documentary evidence (Citation, copy of completion / ongoing certificate and work

- Documentary evidence (Citation, copy of completion / ongoing certificate and work order /Contract) is required for all project experience.
- In case project is on-going projects, a certificate to that effect should be furnished from the competent authority supported with Work Orders/ LoA.
- Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda (or a nominated party) reserves the right to check/validate the authenticity of the information provided by the Bidder for Technical Evaluation criteria and the requisite support must be provided by the Bidder.

8.3 Financial Evaluation

In the second stage, the financial evaluation will be carried out as per this Clause. Each Financial Proposal will be assigned a financial score (SF).

For financial evaluation, the total cost indicated in the Financial Proposal and Illustration given in below

The Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda will determine whether the Financial Proposals are complete and unconditional. The cost indicated in the Financial Proposal shall be deemed as final and reflecting the total cost of services. Omissions, if any, in costing any item shall not entitle the firm to be compensated and the liability to fulfill its obligations as per the TOR within the total quoted price shall be that of the Agency. The lowest Financial Proposal (FM) will be given a financial score (SF) of 100 points. The financial scores of other proposals will be computed as follows:

$$SF = 100 \times FM / F$$

(F = Amount of Financial Proposal)

Provided that the bid is substantially responsive, the Authority shall correct arithmetical errors on the following basis:

If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of the Employer there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the total price as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;

- If there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and
- If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amount expressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail subject to (a) and (b) above.

8.4 Final Evaluation of Bid

Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda will award the Contract to the Bidder based on Quality Cum Cost Basis (QCBS). All the bids will be scrutinized/evaluated as per the criteria given in the RFP documents and a list of successful bidders will be evaluated on the QCBS pattern of 60:40 (Technical Bid - 60% weightage, Financial Bid - 40% weightage)

Proposals will finally be ranked according to their combined technical (ST) and financial (SF) scores as follows:

$$S = ST \times TW + SF \times FW$$

Where S is the combined score, and T and F are weights assigned to Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal that shall be 0.60 and 0.40 respectively.

8.5 Financial Bid Format Instructions

8.5.1 General Instructions

- Financial Bid needs to be submitted offline (separate envelope) as per the instructions given in the RFP in the format prescribed in this section.
- Bidder should provide all prices as per the prescribed format under this Section.
- All the prices are to be entered in Indian Rupees (INR) only.
- Prices indicated in the schedules shall be inclusive of all taxes, Levies, duties, Transportation including GST prices. The prices should also specify Five-year support cost as per provided formats.
- It is mandatory to provide breakup of all Taxes, Duties and Levies wherever asked for.
- Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda reserves the right to ask the Agency to submit proof of payment against any of the taxes, duties, levies indicated.
- The Agency needs to account for all Out-of-Pocket expenses due to Boarding, Lodging and other related items.
- The Unit Rate as mentioned in the following formats may be used for the purpose of 'Change Order' for respective items, if any. However, based on the market trends, Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda retains the right to negotiate this rate for future requirement.
- The successful bidder shall not object to the upward or downward variation in quantities of any item within the variation limits.
- Payment for additional quantities within the variation limit shall be made at tender rates and the tender rates shall be valid for entire duration of the contract.
- No claim shall be entertained or become payable for price variation of additional quantities.
- Bidder shall be bound to give same or more % of discount on the list price of the OEMs on the future purchases (additional purchases within the contract period) by Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda. Bidder shall ensure that the future products supplied are of latest specifications as per the OEM roadmap.
- For the purpose of evaluation of Financial Bids, Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda shall make appropriate assumptions to arrive at a common Bid price for all the bidders. This however shall have no co-relation with the Contract value or actual payment to be made to the Bidder.
- Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda also intends to

utilize various rates obtained through this tender for requirements across various departments. Bidders are requested to factor this larger demand and give the best possible rate to Collector and Chairperson, DWSC, Jharsuguda.

- Agency should refer to the Tender for details on the technical/functional requirements of the system and the benchmark specifications for the items mentioned in the Financial Formats.
- Line items mentioned in the Financial Formats are for representation purpose and Agency may propose alternate technology / solution (with proper justification). Bidders are required to suitably add line items / merge the cost components depending upon their proposed solution.
