ORDER

No. 7353 /Emg. Dated : 05th June-2020

Whereas the National Executive Committee vide Order No.40-3/2020-DM-I(A) Dated.30th May,2020 of Govt. of India in Ministry of Home Affairs has issued directions to all the States and Union Territories for strict implementation of lockdown in Containment Zones up to 30.06.2020 w.e.f. 01.06.2020 and to reopen the prohibited activities in a phased manner in order to contain the spread of COVID-19.

Whereas Govt. of Odisha through the Special Relief Commissioner, has extended the lockdown in the Containment Zones and some other restrictions in the entire State of Odisha till midnight of 30.06.2020.

Whereas the movement of individuals has been strictly prohibited between 7.00 PM to 5.00 AM (next day) except for essential activities.

Whereas the District Collectors / Municipal Commissioners based on their assessment of the situation are authorised to prohibit such other activities or impose such restriction as deemed necessary for containment of the spread of COVID-19.

Now therefore it is incumbent upon the District Disaster Management Authority, Jharsuguda to bring out a specific order in modification of this office order No.6078/Emg. Dated.19.05.2020 and as such the modified order is as follows:

1. The lockdown as prescribed shall continue to remain in force in Containment Zones till 30.06.2020. The Containment Zone, Buffer Zone and restrictions thereon will be prescribed through separate order basing on local condition and gravity of the newly developing situation.

2. **Activities prohibited**

The prohibition as prescribed in regard to different activities in Para-3 of the order of State will remain in force in the whole district outside the Containment Zone. A copy of the relevant page of the order of GoO is attached.

3. **All activities allowed earlier in the manners as prescribed will continue except timing.**

4. **Shop Establishments**

All shop establishments allowed to operate in the previous orders will continue to do that.

5. **Industries and Mining**

Industrial activity and mining will be at full scale and the restrictions of the previous order Dt 19.05.2020 will remain operational.

6. **Permitted with restriction**

The following activities shall be permitted with restriction:

- i. Hotels are allowed to operate with 30% capacity and Restaurant service will be open only for in-house guests subject to room delivery only.
- ii. Restaurants and Hotels are permitted for home delivery / takeaways of food only.
- iii. Saloons, barber shops and betel shops are also allowed to operate with following restrictions.
 - a. The saloon will have arrangement of safety precaution, disinfection and sanitization before and after service of each customer. Further they should keep arrangement for boiling the water to wash scissors and other accessories of hair dressing and shaving. The saloon owner is to also make use of rectified spirit for frequent washing of his tools. He will attend the customers carrying own towels / cloth for wrapping the body. Customers not carrying the same will not be entertained. Blade will be used once for one customer. Deviation will invite strict penal action including closure of the saloon.
 - b. Strict Social distancing, Face covering and sanitization arrangements shall be ensured.
- iv. Dhabas along the NH and SH which have been allowed to operate earlier will remain open for the convenience of the crew of goods carriers.
- v. The liquor shop both ON and OFF are allowed to open from 7 A.M. to 3 P.M. for transaction of **sale by home delivery only**.
- vi. Intra-State Buses, City Buses, Taxis (including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.), Auto Rickshaws and other Passenger Vehicles such as Trekkers, minibuses etc. are allowed to operate up to exhausting the sitting capacity of the vehicle only, as mentioned in the Registration Certificate. Carriage of passengers beyond permitted sitting capacity will invite action under OMV Act and COVID Regulations.

Timing

The shop establishments including restaurants for home delivery including the ones of vegetables, grocery and non-veg edibles will remain open from 7.00 AM to 5.00 PM.

Following Standard Operating Procedure:

Operations which are allowed at SI No 3 to 6 above shall strictly follow the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for the establishments/ activities issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) and other Ministries of Government of India/ Department of H&FW, Government of Odisha, for ensuring social distancing and to contain the spread of COVID-19.

7. Strict regulation in movement & Night Curfew

The movement of individuals between 7.00 PM to 5.00 AM (next day) is strictly prohibited except for essential activities and medical emergency. The goers and returnees to and from different industrial and mining establishments in the night schedule will have exemption from this prohibition. However they have to produce Identity Cards issued by the Employers or Passes given by the appropriate authorities. Their to & fro travel will have reference to the work schedule and accordingly they will be permitted only. As provision of Section-144 of Cr.PC will be in force throughout the district from 7.00 PM to 5.00 AM (next day) the person / party permitted to move in these hours will have to give proof of their identity. Separate order for promulgation of Section-144 of Cr.PC will follow.

In addition to the above the followings are exempted from the restriction:

- District and Municipal Administration/ Police/ Government officials on duty
- Doctors, Medical/ Paramedical Staff (Govt. & Private)
- Staff of IT & ITes Companies on production their ID cards
- Any person, in case of medical or other emergency
- Owner/ staff of chemist shops
- All construction activities
- Movement of Public Transport, private vehicles and taxis (including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.) to and from airports, railway station and bus terminals/ stands/ stops, for facilitating movement of passengers by air, rail and road.

8. Saving the vulnerable

Persons above 65 years of age with co-morbidities, pregnant women, children below the age of 10 years shall stay at home except for essential and health purposes.

9. Social Distancing & COVID Management

a. Face covering: Wearing of face cover is compulsory in public places, in workplaces, and during transport.

b. Social distancing: Individuals must maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet in public places. Wearing of masks and social distancing everywhere is individual responsibility.

c. Shops will ensure physical distancing among customers. The owner of the shop **shall be liable** for any violation. Observance of physical gap and social distancing by the customers is the responsibility of the shop owners. Nothing will be sold to a visiting

purchaser not wearing mask. The owner as well as the manager of the shop shall be held personally responsible for any violation.

Similarly there will be social distancing to be observed at all office establishments. The same is responsibility of heads of offices.

d. Salons and Barber shops shall ensure all safety precautions, disinfection and sanitization before and after service of each customer.

e. Gatherings: Public gatherings/ congregations of more than 7 persons are prohibited.

f. Marriage related gatherings: Number of guests not to exceed 50.

g. Funeral/ last rites related gatherings: Number Of persons not to exceed 20.

h. Spitting in public places will be punishable with fine, as prescribed in accordance with laws, rules or regulations.

i. Consumption of liquor', paan, gutka, tobacco etc. in public places is prohibited.

Additional directives for Work Places

j. Work from home (WfH): As far as possible the practice of WfH should be followed.

k. Staggering of work/ Business hours will be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial & commercial establishments.

l. Screening & hygiene: Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.

m. Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles, etc., will be ensured, including between shifts.

n. Social distancing: All persons in charge of work places will ensure adequate distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.

People not wearing mask and spitting in open will be fined by authorised officers.

10. Penal Provision

Any person violating these measures will be liable to be prosecuted under the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act-2005, besides facing legal action under sec-188 of the IPC, and other provisions as applicable.

emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. There shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of MoHFW shall be taken into consideration for the above purpose.

- iv. District Collectors/ Municipal Commissioners may also identify Buffer Zones outside the Containment Zones, where new cases are more likely to occur. Within the buffer zones, restrictions as considered necessary may be put in place by the Local authorities.

3. Graded re-opening of areas outside the Containment Zones

In areas outside Containment Zones, activities will be regulated as below:

- a. The following establishments/ activities will continue to remain closed till 30th June, 2020:
 - (i) Religious places/ places of worship for public.
 - (ii) Shopping malls
 - (iii) International air travel of passengers, except as permitted by MHA.
 - (iv) Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
 - (v) Social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious functions and other large congregations.
- b. ✓ Hotels will be allowed to operate up to 30% capacity. Restaurant service will be open only for in-house guests.
- c. Restaurants and Hotels are permitted for home delivery/ takeaways of food.
- d. Schools, colleges, other educational/ training/ coaching institutions, etc. will remain closed till 31st July, 2020.

Activities that are not specifically prohibited/ regulated/ restricted above are allowed.

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for the establishments/ activities mentioned above issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) and other Ministries of Government of India/ Department of H&FW, Government of Odisha, for the above activities will be strictly followed for ensuring social distancing and to contain the spread of COVID-19.

4. Directives for COVID-19 Management

The following Directives for COVID-19 Management shall be strictly followed throughout the State:
